STEER CLEAR OF CAR CRIME

Don't leave items on display - Even an old coat or plastic bag can tempt a thief, they steal first and think later!

Fit an immobiliser or car alarm – preventing your vehicle from starting is the best way to stop a thief

PARK SAFELY AND ALWAYS USE AN ATTENDED OR WELL LIT CAR PARK

Try these steps to deter thief's:

- \Rightarrow Fit a steering wheel lock
- \Rightarrow Fit wheel locking nuts
- \Rightarrow Etch your index number on windows, windscreens and headlamps
- \Rightarrow Mark all your equipment like car stereo with your postcode

WARNING

Dyfed Powys Police are warning residents to be aware of distraction burglaries and related suspicious incidents in your area.

It has been reported that people are posing as Water board employee's who come to check the water, or the Gas Board have come to check the meter etc...

We need to remind residents **if you are not expecting a caller DO NOT let them in.** Water board/utility companies will tend to make appointments before calling, therefore if no appointment has been made the householder should not let them into their home.

Please be mindful of the above when answering your door; please follow these steps to keep yourself and your home safe:

LOCKED – Is anyone expected? Is the back door locked?

CHAIN – Put the Chain ON before opening the door!

CHECK – ALWAYS ask for caller's I.D / Check it by phone if need be!

PAVS Voluntary Sector Funding Fair with themed workshops in partnership with the WCVA 18th November 2008 Queens Hall, Narberth

The successful PAVS Funding Fair, now in its third year, is coming to you even bigger and better than before. This year's event, "Funding the Future" builds on the success of previous events and is essential for anyone involved in funding the future of their organisation.

The voluntary sector faces a changing funding climate - with a drive towards sustainable funding, opportunities presented by European Funding programmes and a move to tendering and procurement for delivery of services. In spite of this it is still acknowledged that grants will continue to have a place, in one shape or form, as a source of funding for the sector.

Funding

Elizabeth Finn Care

Elizabeth Finn Care is a charity offering financial support to people living on low incomes.

They have funding specifically reserved to help families in Wales, with the aim of alleviating poverty and if appropriate, supporting their return to work through covering the cost of retraining.

Support can consist of:

Small regular income of up to £20.00 a week A fund to draw on when substantial unexpected expenses occur Support with vocational course fees of up to £1,000 a year Transport expenses up to £750 a year House and home grants towards essential repairs, or replacing household items.

Applicants will need to meet the Elizabeth Finn Care qualifying criteria, please visit the website for more information.

They welcome applications from all individuals, not just families, in Wales, who are in need.

Trusthouse Charitable Foundation

The Trusthouse Charitable Foundation has issued new guidelines for applicants.

The new guidelines result from a thorough overhaul of the Foundation's priorities and focus on rural issues and urban deprivation throughout the UK through projects involving: community support; disability and healthcare; arts, education and heritage.

Applications are invited from local or national charities or not-for-profit organisations within two main themes: rural areas with populations of less than 10,000; urban areas with populations above 10,000 and within the most deprived 20 per cent of areas as defined by government Indices of Multiple Deprivation.

Grants are given for one year only and fall into three categories: large grants (\pounds 10,000 - \pounds 30,000); small grants (\pounds 5,001 - \pounds 9,999); and fast track grants (\pounds 5,000 and below).

Applications dealt with as received. Large and small grant decisions are made at quarterly meetings and fast track grants are processed more quickly.
